Inclement Weather Late Start or Snow Day
La Salle High School
2023-2024

Students of La Salle High School come from a very large geographic area. Our van drivers to the lower and upper valley and designated weather spotters call in to a central person in order for us to determine whether or not we will call a Late Start or Snow Day. The school will use Power Announcement (voice, text, or email) to communicate to staff, parents, guardians, and students about possible late starts, snow days or emergencies this winter.

In the case of inclement weather:

By **6:30 am**, an official **Late Start** will be reported through Power Announcement, Facebook, and the school website.

By **8:00 am**, if necessary, an official **Snow Day** will be reported through Power Announcement, Facebook, and the school website.

If you have not done so, please remember to log onto PowerSchool to identify your preferred modes of communication through Power Announcement. Your student has already verified their own communication preferences. Please remind your student to drive slowly in the event of ice or snow. Most weather-related accidents are caused by teenagers driving too quickly for conditions.

Digital Learning Day

If a **Snow Day** is called, students will be required to complete the day's coursework assigned to them. On these digital learning days, assignments for the day will be posted by instructors to their PowerSchool Class Pages by 10am. Students will be expected to have this coursework completed by the next school day, unless otherwise directed by their teacher.

Responsibility: Are We Connected?

**There must be union between you,
genuine courtesy toward lay people and
great patience with your students.**

-Saint John Baptist de La Salle

Responsibility simply means one's ability to make a response. When the apostles said "Yes" to follow the vision and teachings of Jesus, they set the foundation for the Church that we have today, a community with traditions. When Jesus said, "Whatsoever you do for the least of the people, you do for me" (Mt 25:40) he began a worldwide effort to tend to the needs of the marginalized. Based upon this faith commitment, hospitals, nursing homes, social services, and schools have become the hallmark of Christian responsibility.

When Saint John Baptist de La Salle saw the conditions of those living in poverty, especially the young children who did not have a promising future, he responded by starting schools. He came to realize that he could not do this alone and so he invited teachers to become Brothers. He took them into his home, taught them, fed them and established rules for them. De La Salle and the Brothers became interdependent in establishing schools in the Lasallian tradition.

The Brothers were identified by the letters FSC, which are an abbreviation for Fratres Scholarum Christianum, Latin for the Brothers of the Christian Schools. Today, we might expand the meaning of FSC to signify Faith, Service, and Charity.

1. **Faith** is more than a cognitive or intellectual activity. It involves a personal relationship with Our Lord and other people. John Baptist de La Salle determined that the spirit of faith would be a pillar of his efforts to change the world through education. People of faith enter into fundamental relationships that impact one another. People of faith make responsible commitments to:

- a relationship with God
- a relationship with themselves
- a relationship with other people
- a relationship with all creation

2. **Service** is the activity that reaches out to those who are needy or wounded. Throughout his life Jesus offered visible signs of service when he fed the hungry, cured the suffering, welcomed the unwanted and washed the feet of his disciples saying, "I have come to serve, not to be served." As a man of deep faith, De La Salle organized schools to serve the needs of society. These needs were so great that De La Salle named the second pillar of his efforts the spirit of zeal—that is, a spirit of complete and energetic dedication to a mission. Both Jesus and De La Salle gave new hope and life to others.

3. **Charity** is the attitude that fills our heart and empowers us to give of ourselves in service. As Saint Paul wrote, "Your attitude must be that of Christ" (Philippians 2:5). It is charity or love that elevates our service into expressions of faith and salvation. In one of the most quoted passages, Paul gives priority to charity, saying, "I may have faith to move mountains, but if I have no love, I am nothing. I may give all that I possess to the needy and I may give my body over to be burned, but if I have no love, I gain nothing by it" (1 Cor 13:3). The founder of the Christian Brothers advised them, "Show much kindness and love to the students you teach.

The more tenderness you show your students, the more they will see God in you." Thus, charity was, in St. John Baptist's vision, the virtue that most powerfully and surely led to salvation. The person of faith becomes a responsible servant when s/he sees the need and offers hope and then is motivated to act out of love. While faith and hope are the foundation, the greatest response is love.

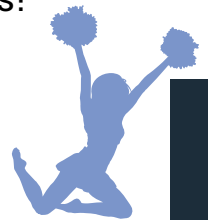

Recapping the fall sports season, the football team claimed a co-league championship and had several athletes selected to the all-league teams. Johan Valladares, Tyler Do, and Justus Barker were selected to first team, Jaiden James, Kai Hanrahan, Ian Judd, Adan Villalobos and Andrew Mauch made 2nd team while Roman Manrique-Vivanco earned honorable mention. Johan was also selected as the offensive player of the year while Justus Barker claimed league lineman of the year. Coach Cody Lamb was selected as coach of the year. In Soccer, Marissa Badillo and Olivia Alegria earned 1st team recognition while Ella Craig was selected to the 2nd team. Volleyball saw Natalie Overby selected to 1st team and Natalia Valladares earned honorable mention. Andrew Berger claimed 1st team recognition in Cross-Country.
