



Dear Parents,

I am happy to share that construction of our administration building has begun! In 2022 school administration determined a need to prioritize this project. The current administration offices have been located in modular buildings that were purchased used in 2000 and were given a life expectancy of fifteen years.

This building is part of a campus master plan approved by the La Salle Board of Trustees in 2000 and will be prominently situated in the front of school as a beautiful welcoming place for visitors, students and parents. The building has been fully funded by long-time benefactors of La Salle for the restricted purposes of this project. We are so deeply grateful for the long list of financial supporters who have helped us build our campus over the years for the benefit of our students.

The 3000+ square foot building will house school administration, Advancement, Finance and Admissions Offices. Our longtime construction partner, Tri-Ply Construction, along with a community of subcontractors who have been involved in the development of most of our campus buildings, will take the lead on construction.

Please join us on **Friday, February 9th at 2:45** for a brief groundbreaking ceremony to celebrate this important next phase in the development of our beautiful campus.

Sharing Our Story: Remembering the Presence of God

Faith, much like all of life, is a journey. All of us go through stages, trials, surprises, failures and eventually, an awareness of who we are and who God is for us and our world. Faith is rooted in the past but must be reflected upon in the present in order to provide direction to the future. By reflecting upon the events of our lives, we can see, "with the eyes of faith," God working in our lives. Faith plays a role in the development of adolescents. During the teenage years, students will challenge, test, build upon, and form their own identity. This is done in the context of the communities to which they belong. It is important for teachers to accompany teens through this searching for faith identity – lending example, challenging preconceptions and stereotypes, and proposing ways of understanding.

John Baptist de La Salle compares the role of the teacher to that of guardian angels:
"Without someone to put God's truths into more concrete forms for their developing and distracted minds, they may
well never be able to understand and practice what is so necessary for their salvation. This is why God in his
providence has appointed you their visible guardian angels to perform this ministry in their regard." (MTR 5.1)

We gain a sense of ourselves by sharing our stories with others. At the same time, our encounter with others influences us. Certain events, experiences, places and people are a powerful influence on our journey through life.


May we encounter people who act as guides, models, and heroes for us.

"Indeed, if I had ever thought that the care I was taking of the schoolmasters out of pure charity would ever have made it my duty to live with them, I would have dropped the whole project. For since, naturally speaking, I considered the men whom I was obliged to employ in the schools at the beginning as being inferior to my valet, the mere thought that I would have to live with them would have been insupportable to me. Indeed, I experienced a great deal of unpleasantness when I first had them come to my house. This lasted two years. It was undoubtedly for this reason that God, Who guides all things with wisdom and serenity, Whose way it is not to force the inclinations of persons, willed to commit me entirely to the development of the schools. He did this in an imperceptible way and over a long period of time so that one commitment led to another in a way that I did not foresee in the beginning."


