Parent and Student Surveys



Inclement Weather Late Start or Snow Day La Salle High School 2023-2024

Students of La Salle High School come from a very large geographic area. Our van drivers to the lower and upper valley and designated weather spotters call in to a central person in order for us to determine whether or not we will call a Late Start or Snow Day. The school will use Power Announcement (voice, text, or email) to communicate to staff, parents, guardians, and students about possible late starts, snow days or emergencies this winter.

In the case of inclement weather:

By **6:30 am**, an official **Late Start** will be reported through Power Announcement, Facebook, and the school website.

By **8:00 am**, if necessary, an official **Snow Day** will be reported through Power Announcement, Facebook, and the school website.

If you have not done so, please remember to log onto PowerSchool to identify your preferred modes of communication through Power Announcement. Your student has already verified their own communication preferences. Please remind your student to drive slowly in the event of ice or snow. Most weather-related accidents are caused by teenagers driving too quickly for conditions.

Digital Learning Day

If a **Snow Day** is called, students will be required to complete the day's coursework assigned to them. On these digital learning days, assignments for the day will be posted by instructors to their PowerSchool Class Pages by 10am. Students will be expected to have this coursework completed by the next school day, unless otherwise directed by their teacher.

On this day we recognize the pivotal event in the history of our Institute when Saint La Salle and two Brothers gathered in November of 1691 to make their public commitment to the fledging network of Lasallian schools known (see page 7). Dignity - You Got It

The most excellent and important creatures God brought into being are angels and human beings; in fact it was for their sake that He created all the rest.

Saint John Baptist de La Salle, the person who organized the Brothers more than 300 years ago in France, and the person who started schools like the one we are in right now, knew that the dignity of people was one of the most important things they had. The poor people of that time were often too involved in simply surviving to even think of their dignity, let alone know what it involved.

As part of the education that De La Salle and the Brothers introduced, they included all sorts of ways of bringing students and parents to realize their dignity. For example:

- Each student was interviewed with his parents before being able to come to school, so that the teachers would be able to respect the uniqueness of that student and his family situation.
- The first book that students read after learning to read was a book on politeness and civil behavior, so that they could gradually feel comfortable in all sorts of social situations and know how to treat others with dignity (which would lead to themselves being treated with dignity).
- Students were expected to treat one another with respect and dignity. Classrooms were arranged so that all social distinctions were removed; everyone sat together according to their ability in class, not according to their rank in society; students were placed in charge of class responsibilities based on their character, not based on their possessions; teachers were never to receive any gifts from students, so that they would not have favorites or show preference to some students over others; and so on.
- Before a correction or punishment was given for some misbehavior, the teacher had to make sure that it was fair and wasn't given out of anger, and the student had to agree that he had misbehaved, and that the punishment was deserved.
- If a student gave the wrong answer in class, teasing and laughing were not tolerated.

Instead, the teacher had another student give the correct answer and would then return to the first student to have him answer a question very closely related to the first one, so that each student could achieve something positive and learn in the process.

Through school structures like these, it quickly became clear to both new students and parents that in this school, the dignity of the person was something real, something worth building up, and something that was part of what it meant to be a child of God.



Heroic Vow

November is the month we celebrate the Heroic Vow

This month we celebrate the Heroic Vow, a defining moment in our Institute's history and moment in our Lasallian narrative which serves as a great source of encouragement to a young school community, like our own.

In 1691, John Baptist de La Salle, at the age of forty, took stock of his situation. Ten years had passed since he had first brought the schoolmasters to live with his family. He had little cause for joy. It was true that there were eight charity schools functioning and giving general satisfaction. On the other hand,




there had been quite a number of deaths among the Brothers, idealistic young men carried off by the exhausting nature of their work in deplorable conditions. The fact that their deaths had been uniformly edifying did not compensate for the loss of such men. How, John wondered, was he to keep the schools staffed? How was he to meet the requests that came to him to open more? The training establishment for lay teachers had now produced sufficient village schoolmasters for the needs of the rural areas in the vicinity of Rheims and had ceased to operate. Vocations to the Community had almost dried up. It began to look as if the whole enterprise might crumble in the hands of its founder. Understandably, John felt the need of support and encouragement and for this he turned to two of the Brothers in whom he had special confidence. Convinced, in spite of everything, that the work of the Christian Schools should go forward, he persuaded these two Brothers to join with him in making a vow that even if everybody else abandoned them they would cling together and try to keep the Institute going, even if it should mean begging for their meals, even if it meant living on bread alone. This heroic vow they pronounced on the feast of the Presentation of Our Lady, 21st November 1691. For John Baptist de La Salle it was a keymoment in his journey of faith.



The fall sports season is winding down and all programs are heading to post-season play. The football team beat Naches in a thrilling come from behind win (21 to 14) in their last regular season game and will now play Connell (at Marquette) on Friday, November 3rd in a district cross-over playoff game. Volleyball recently beat Naches (3 to 0) and will now travel to Connell on Tuesday, October 31st for a first-round district match. Girls' soccer recently beat Wahluke and will now play at Toppenish on Tuesday, October 31st for a third-round district match. Cross-Country competed in the district event on Friday, October 27th.
