Financial aid is limited, so please act promptly.

From the Desk of the President

Dear Parents,

As registration for the 24-25 academic year begins, I invite you to consider two important ways you can support the school as you are reading through your tuition and fees contract. As you will see, the cost to La Salle to offer your children a Catholic college preparatory education in the Lasallian tradition is about \$17,900. Tuition for next year is set at \$13,545. About 70% of our families receive some level of financial aid based on financial need.

Two ways you can help are first, by making a parent pledge of any amount when you sign your contract and secondly, ensure you are making every effort to assist the school through the completion of your thirty parent hours. Both of these efforts allow us to set the price of a Lasallian education well below our cost to educate.

Like other schools, we have seen a significant downturn in parent participation in the life of the school since COVID. I appeal to you to make the time in the remainder of this year and into the new academic year to sign-up for the many year-round opportunities to serve La Salle. Like most Catholic schools, we are wholly dependent on our parent volunteers for the smooth running of school programs. Without parent assistance, extra-curricular programs would be discontinued and costs to the school would significantly increase.


The Founding Story: The Five Core Principles

Where Did These Come From?

In March 1992, a Student Leaders Workshop was held for student leaders from Lasallian schools across the District of San Francisco. One of the presenters was Br. Ronald Isetti, FSC, a Brother at Saint Mary's College, an author and teacher of history. He presented a list of six Lasallian characteristics that were derived from his reading of one of the principle documents from the 2nd session of the 39th General Chapter (1967), "The Brothers of the Christian Schools in the World Today: A Declaration."

The following year, students at a similar workshop condensed the six characteristics into the five core principles we have today. Short phrases based on those five principles were put on banners for the main hallway of La Salle High School in Milwaukie, OR, and began to appear in some format elsewhere in the District.

These principles have resonated with the experience of many Lasallians and have been adopted by many Lasallian schools, colleges, and other ministries. They are an accessible organizational means of engaging in serious conversation about Lasallian ministry and those who live it out every day.



What does it mean to be "Lasallian" today?

Being Lasallian is more about attitudes and views of education than about formal structures, because these shape structures. Lasallian education has the school as its setting, the teacher as its focus, and the salvific potential of education as its inspiration. De La Salle's writings show that the Lasallian educator's life with his or her students constitutes the very center his or her religious experience. God is encountered in the school, in the classroom. There is no separation between the professional journey and the spiritual journey. Both are aspects of a single vocation and commitment to education. Likewise, Lasallian pedagogy is Lasallian precisely because of, not in spite of or along with, its spiritual dimensions. It is ultimately their spiritual life that motivated, shaped, and realized the pedagogy of De La Salle and his Brothers. Lasallian spirituality focuses on the approach, implementation, and context of the activity of education. De La Salle described the spirit[uality] of the Institute in terms of faith and zeal, a single spirit consisting of two parts that are intimately related. Both come to fruition in the single ministry of teaching and the very practical and spiritual work of education.


